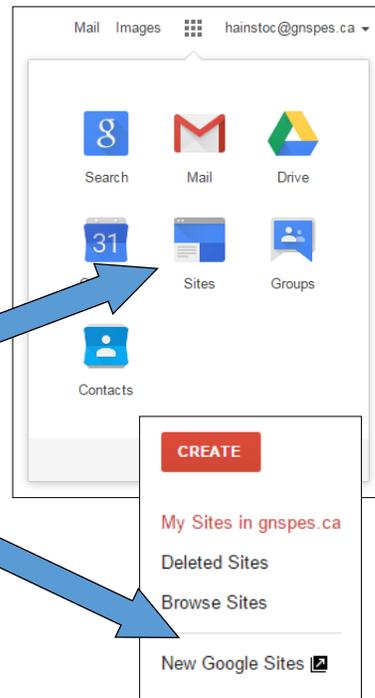


# What's New in Google Apps in the AVRSB for 2016 ?

## Google Sites (new version)

Google Sites went through a major overhaul over the summer and is now available for teachers and students. You can create professional webpages that adapt to various screens and mobile devices, using content from your GNSPES Google Drive, YouTube, Maps or Calendar. This is ideal for class websites or student projects, as it is a simple drag-and-drop interface and requires no experience in web design and publishing.

1. To access Sites, login into your GNSPES account and click on the square app launcher in the top right corner of the window (or type in <https://sites.google.com>).
2. When Sites launches, look for the "New Google Sites" link. You can continue using the old version and sites you created in that version.

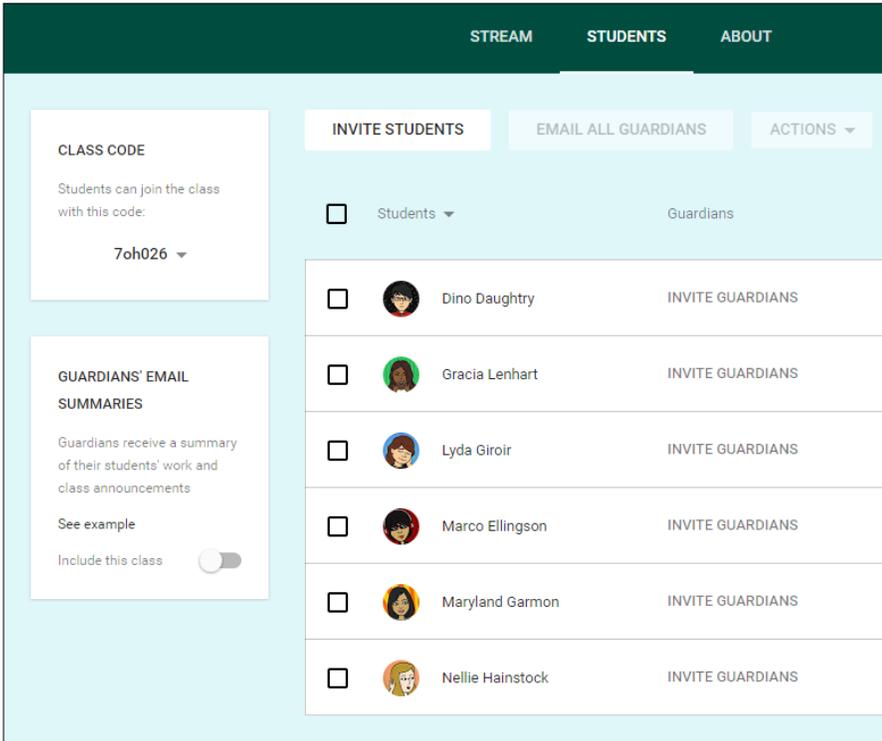

# Google Classroom Updates

## Guardian Summaries:

In the “Students” section of a particular class, you can invite guardians to receive regular email updates on class activities specific to their child—including missing work, upcoming work, and class activities.

You have the ability to turn this feature on for each class, and guardians can choose whether to participate and how often they receive the email summary. If more than one teacher have the summary active, the guardian only receives a single email that summarizes all classes.

For teachers, there is no management—other than inviting the parent at the beginning of the school year.

## Stream Topics:

One of the biggest complaints from teachers and students was the length of the Classroom “Stream” as you added content and assignments throughout the year.

The “Topics” feature allows you to tag a topic to announcements, assignments, and questions, and then lists the course topics along the side of the screen. This allows students to click on a particular topic and only see the content that pertains to that topic. So, a teacher could organize topics by each unit of study or particular dates—and keep their Classroom Stream more manageable.
